## JUNIOR AND SENIOR HIGH YOUTH NEWS

### REAL. PRESENT. GOD.

What an incredible time was had by all of Zion's youth! To gather as a small part of the 21,000 youth plus chaperones and volunteers in Minneapolis was amazing! We are not few; WE ARE MANY! The LCMS church is alive and energized!

Our time started out early Wednesday morning on our flights that left at 6:15am from Oakland and Seattle. Isaak and Isabel Barratt joined us. Thanks for the early morning flight Mr. Harger. Pastor flew with the crew from Oakland, met up with the Seattle group in Denver and then flew on to Minneapolis where Mr. Harger, Sam, and Tasha were waiting excitedly to meet them. We had a slow connection with our hotel bus (an hour and a half wait), but after that the fun began! We enjoyed a relaxing evening of swimming, pizza, Uno, and sharing stories as the group members had been apart for awhile. On Thursday, Mr. Harger checked us into the Gathering and carried 7 backpacks with Bibles, t-shirts and other information on the mile walk back to the hotel. Then the group explored a local farmers market before heading out for a Mississippi River cruise on the Minneapolis Queen. The walking directions took a long and unique route so we were extra tired. The river cruise was fun going through locks and learning some of the history of Minneapolis. That evening the Gathering officially kicked off. The gathering of all of the participants in US Bank Stadium, home of the Minnesota Vikings, was amazing. The throng of bodies walking to and waiting to get into the stadium is a wonder to behold. The Mass Event was inspiring and exciting. After the Mass Event was a Toby Mac concert! This Christian music group had the crowd praising God long into the night! We got back to our hotel at about midnight.

Friday through Sunday were much of the same schedule, up for breakfast and leaving the hotel by 8:30 am to walk to

the convention center for Bible Study with 7,000 people. Then four smaller sectional times (500-3000 people). The topics that were offered and that we attended were greatly varied. Topics that are very serious (abortion, divorce, sexuality, dealing with our neighbors, etc.) to NBA player, Sam Decker from Sheboygan Lutheran High School, to Science and Faith, to comedians, and so many more that we could not get to them all. There was also an Interactive Center where the Concordia Universities do some recruiting, many organizations have displays, each LCMS District shares a little of what they are about and of course games to blow off steam. Such fun things as human bowling, human hungry, hungry hippo, axe throwing, tricycle racing and more. Each day the Zion participants went together to Bible Study and then split up for the sessions attending 2-3 sessions a day plus time in the Interactive Center. Our service project was packing meals for Feed My Starving Children. The crew we were part of packed 86,000 meals in just over an hour. Every evening, while walking to dinner and at dinner, everyone had the opportunity to share news from the sessions they attended and what they learned and were taking away. Like from Sam Decker, "Be present where your feet are." This was about getting off the devices and paying attention to the people you are with. After dinner it was off to the stadium for the Mass Event, another concert with I AM THEY on Friday, and The Skit Guys on Saturday. Late nights for all of them.

Monday morning was just at the stadium but what a time it was having a closing worship service with the Gathering Choir and Orchestra. They were made up of youth that had to audition before the Gathering and then give up time each day to rehearse. President Harrison gave the message on "Amen. It's in the bag!" Then if you think our communion takes awhile, try communion for over 23,000 people! Thanks goodness that there were over



100 communion stations with Pastors that were attending the the Gathering. It was an inspiring and uplifting service!

Monday afternoon after a quick lunch and a nap, we were off to the Mall of America for an afternoon of shopping, roller coasters and our last dinner together. When we got back from the Mall, we hung out together in the lobby playing Hector's newly purchased card game, Bang! Another late night. Up and on the bus to the airport at 8:20 am. The flights all went smoothly and everyone arrived home on time with people waiting to greet them.

We truly learned about God being "Real" in so many ways; that He is "Present" in everything we do, wherever we go, and our acts of witness can be both great and small; and the He is "God" all powerful, all knowing, and ready to accept us just as we are - sinners with many different stains - loving and forgiving everyone!

# Multiply Disciples

Prayers of Praise and  
Declaring What God has Done

God's will for us, His children, is to continually praise Him and to tell others what He has done. In II Thessalonians 5:16-18, Paul writes that we are to rejoice, pray without ceasing and to be thankful - "for this is God's will for you in Christ." Luther writes after listing all that God has done for us, "All this He does only out of Fatherly divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me." And then we are instructed: "For all this, it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him." (Luther's Small Catechism: Apostle's Creed: First Article)

We don't need to worry about anything, but depend on the God who created us and all things. The center (heart) of prayer is thankfulness. There are many examples of prayers of praise throughout the Bible. David writes in Psalm 16: "You have made known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in Your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand." "O Lord, you are my God, I will exalt You and praise Your name for in perfect faithfulness You have done marvelous things – things You planned long ago." (Isaiah 25:1) And Mary's beautiful prayer of praise upon hearing that she was to give birth to the Messiah: "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, for He has been mindful of the humble state of His servant." (Luke 1:47, 48)

We come together in worship to sing songs of praise. This keeps our focus on Him and strengthens our faith. Part of our worship is declaring what God has done for us. When we hear about what God is doing in the lives of others and how our prayers are being answered, our hearts are strengthened with renewed faith. In the Gospel of Luke, chapter 8, after Jesus has miraculously delivered a man from demons, Jesus tells that man to go home and declare what God has done for him. The verb used is to "go on recounting" what things God has done. These retellings strengthen our faith and serve as a witness and encouragement to others.

On April 22, the Monday after Easter, as I was driving to school, I suffered a stroke. It affected my balance and my fine motor skills, but I was able to drive to school. I even managed to give a new student assessment the following day. I couldn't understand why I had such a hard time keeping my balance. Finally my sons took me to the emergency room at Kaiser, San Leandro. Many tests later, a young neurologist came to me and told me I had had a stroke. But could she do one more test? She noticed something about the blood vessels surrounding my brain. The test showed that those blood vessels were filled with plaque. My mother had suffered many strokes and the tests never showed why. Now I would be put on medication to keep that from happening again. The neurologist said, "Hopefully you'll never need to see a neurologist again." God had allowed this to happen in order to prevent me from having more serious strokes.

When I fell the following week, God had one of the top orthopedic surgeons on staff that day. She was able to surgically repair my broken hip. Returning home after a week in a rehabilitation facility, I was surrounded by the love and support of my family. My friends, coworkers and pastor, all demonstrated their love and support. The prayers and cards of encouragement were an incredible blessing. Being in a wheelchair gave me a new perspective. People would go out of their way to hold a door open or share an encouraging word. My younger son commented on how much closer we were as a family.

I am amazed at all God has done and continues to do throughout this ordeal. And now that I am using my roller/walker and getting out to see His creation, I continue to thank Him, for He is by my side and at times, He carries me.



**Catechism Corner**

Some Words from Dr. Luther

Luther was often asked to inscribe Bibles and other books. In one Bible, this was his encouragement:

**We should and must by all means read Scripture. For it was put into letters and was constantly preserved in the church through the special dispensation of God (and will also remain in the church until the end of the world) that we might read, learn, and constantly further and spread the Word, to children's children . . . See to it that you by all means read Scripture faithfully and that you rightly divide the Word of truth that IS, that you look for nothing in it for your person except Me [Christ], without whom no one comes to the Father and that from Scripture you teach this to others. (What Luther Says)**

According to Luther in his section on Daily Prayers, how many times in a day should one pray the Lord's Prayer? What do you think? Any guesses? It depends on how many times a day you eat. But in general the answer is 8 times in a day. After you wake up, as part of your prayers before and after each meal, and as you go to bed.


