## *Pastor Paul writes...*

We are now at the halfway point in the Year of the Bible at Zion. Our goal is to activate everyone in daily reading the Bible. Our theme is: "Each one in God's Word each day!" The members of Zion's Board of Directors have shared with each other what they are doing for their own daily Bible reading and the depth and scope of their Bible reading is really remarkable. Our leaders at Zion are truly leading the way for us!

You may remember that a few months ago I wrote about my Bible reading plan of reading of one Gospel each week. I have been doing that for over two years now and so far I have read each of the four Gospels a total of thirty times. It is an amazing journey.

But my reading of the Gospels each day is only a part of my daily Bible reading. I have also been reading the Bible, verse by verse, book by book, using one of my favorite Bible commentaries. The picture you see is of my complete set of the People's Bible Commentary, published by Concordia Publishing House. Each volume provides the complete text of Scripture and then gives a substantial theological and practical commentary on the text. Earlier this year I completed the last book of this series and all 66 books of the Bible! Now I have started doing my book-by-book reading of the Bible with my next-favorite commentary. It's a great way to learn and apply Scripture.

I am not proposing that everyone needs to read a Gospel a week for a year or read the entire Bible using a theological commentary. That works for me. But I simply encourage you to identify the method or the plan or the tool that will best help you to read and grow in God's Word every day. Whatever you decide, God will bless your reading of His Word! If you haven't started yet, now is the time! The Bible awaits!

For a while we thought that we would also have Park City, Utah and Pasadena, CA, sadly those participants just didn't work out. We have coordinated flights from Oakland (kids and Pastor) and Seattle to meet in Denver and then on to Minneapolis together on July 10th. The others will already be there as Mr. Harger's parents are celebrating their 60th Anniversary in Rice Lake, WI on July 6th. We will all meet at the Minneapolis/St. Paul Airport. Pastor will then be flying back and the rest of us will go to the gathering. Buying all the tickets was sure fun!

During the five days of the Gathering, youth spend time together in God's word, worship, service and fellowship with others from across the synod and around the world. The Guiding Principles of the National Youth Gathering are:

- Youth Gatherings proclaim the Lordship of Jesus Christ and God's saving grace to His people through Christ. In this setting, young people grow in their personal relationship with God and grow in their fellowship of Word and Sacrament in Christ's Church.

- Youth Gatherings are a vehicle by which the Church reaches out to, cares for and affirms young people, both church and unchurched.

- Youth Gatherings equip youth and adults for ministry in a variety of settings in their congregations, communities, and world.

- Youth Gatherings celebrate the meaning of Christian joy in all of life's situations.

- Youth Gatherings recognize and affirm the diversity of God's people

These are accomplished through the many speakers on a great variety of topics, Mass Gatherings, large (3000+ people) Bible Studies, activities, servant events, and so much more.

The Zion participants would like to thank the members of Zion for all of the financial support that has been showered upon us and now for your prayers as we prepare, travel and gather with about 25,000 other youth in Minneapolis. We leave on July 10th and return on July 16th. 

*“Holy Spirit, light divine,

Cachunk, cachunk, zing, grrrrr, grrrr - go the sounds of the machines looking for explanations to what is happening. What will the tests show?

Cachunk! I will try to pray "Our Father....dear Jesus help me!!" And that is when God sends His gift to all believers – the Holy Spirit. After Jesus ascended into Heaven, He promised to send a helper – a Paraclete to His believers.

On one occasion, after He [Jesus] was eating with them, He gave them this command: 'Do not go into Jerusalem, but wait for the gift My Father promised, which you have heard Me speak about. For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' (Acts 1:4-5)

The Holy Spirit helps to understand God's word. The Holy Spirit gives us the ability to learn what God wants us to learn. The Holy Spirit empowers us by giving us the words to say. When a friend is going through a difficult time, the Holy Spirit gives us the words and actions that show the love of Jesus. And when there are no words, the Holy Spirit takes our prayers to the Father's throne. "In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express. And He who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints in accordance with God's will." (Romans 8:26-27)

Did you know that there six and ½ pages of Symbols and Their Meanings in the Appendix of Luther’s Small Catechism? Here are a few, watch for more in the coming month



John is represented by an eagle. John’s Gospel soars with Christ’s love and power.



The sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit (**Isaiah 11:2-3**), who gives us His gifts through the Means of Grace—God’s Word and the Sacraments.



Symbol of the Holy Trinity (**Matthew 28:19**).



The Greek cross has arms of equal length. Five Greek crosses, for the five wounds of Christ (**John 20:19-20**), are sometimes seen on altar cloths.



God the Father is depicted as the hand of creation and blessing (**Psalms 145:13-16**).



The Latin cross is the favorite and most widely recognized of the crosses. It represents the cross upon which Jesus gave His life for the sins of the world (**Acts 2:23**).



Each point on the Maltese cross represents one of the eight Beatitudes from Christ’s Sermon on the Mount (**Matthew 5:3-10**).



The Tau cross (also called the Old Testament cross or the cross of prophecy, shaped for the cross Moses raised in the wilderness) connects Old Testament prophecy with the fulfillment of the promise of salvation in Christ Jesus (**John 3:14-15**).


### **IRON MEN**

### **WHAT’S IN A NAME?**

I once had a dog that was named Zoomer - does that give you a clue as to how fast she traveled around the dog park? We also had a dog named Coco - does that indicate her color? Lil One was the smallest of the dogs and Buddy was just that - my buddy. The cat was named Pumpkin because she had a bright orange nose. Very often a pet’s or a person’s name will describe them, their physical attributes or their traits. Naming an animal in our household has never been a problem as they all showed some trait that ended up in their name.

Some of the names that the Bible ascribes to God are also very revealing - Judge, Ruler, King. The one that I like most is Father. A true father protects his children, makes sure they have what they need and loves them with unrequited love. This is how I look at God, my Father. He protects me from harm : once when driving from Eugene to Modesto and I almost fell asleep, once when someone cut in front of me when actually there was no room, once when a piece of heavy equipment we were hoisting broke free and missed my foot by nothing. I’m sure there are many other examples of things that happen everyday to keep me safe and I am not even aware of them.

Do I have what I need? Definitely YES! I have a home, money to pay the bills and more than enough food. Most importantly, My Father loved me so much that he sent His only Son, Jesus, to suffer and be put to death on the cross. Just imagine the pain of being whipped, a crown of thorns being shoved on your head and nails going through your hands and feet. Then my Father kept his promise that Jesus would rise from the dead to show us that all his promises were true and that we would rise to live with Him forever. Yes, God my loving Father and I am thankful for everything he did and does for me daily.


