Pastor Paul writes...



As I write this article, I am thinking back to exactly one year ago when I was blessed to be one of the fourteen adventurers from Zion who traveled to the Holy Land and walked in the footsteps of Jesus. We visited Bethlehem, where Jesus was born; Nazareth where Jesus grew up; the Jordan River, where Jesus was baptized by John; Cana, where Jesus performed His first miracle (changing water into wine); Capernaum, which became the headquarters of Jesus' Galilean ministry; the Sea of Galilee, which Jesus crossed often with His disciples; the Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus prayed on the night of His betrayal and arrest; and we walked the Via Dolorosa (the Way of Sorrows), which follows Jesus' path to the cross of Calvary.

A high point on our trip was celebrating Holy Communion at the Garden Tomb. And we visited many more places and did many more things, of course, including standing on Mount Carmel, where Elijah defeated the prophets of Baal, taking a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee, and floating in the Dead Sea.

I have been remembering the meaningful details of our Holy Land experience daily as I read and reread the four Gospels and as I prepare for my Sunday sermons. With the hundreds of pictures I took on our trip, I regularly change the screen saver on my computer with a fresh view of the Holy Land. I tell people: "I can't wait to go back again!" Some people are ready to go back again, others are anxious to go for their very first time and few have responded with a little surprise. "You want to go again?" they ask. You see, having been to the Holy Land once, they are now ready to travel to new places and experience new adventures, which is completely understandable.

I can't help thinking that some people may approach the Bible with a similar attitude. Some may say: "I did my share of Bible reading for Confirmation instruction." Or perhaps: "I've read enough of the Bible to know what it says. Now I want to read something new."

Now, I can fully understand taking a "once-in-a-lifetime" trip to the Holy Land. But I have a hard time understanding an attitude which has no real interest or motivation to read the Bible on a daily basis. Jesus spoke clearly of the eternal character of the words of the Bible; Jesus declared: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away." Jesus also testified to the life-transforming truths of the Bible; Jesus declared: "The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life!"

2019 the "Year of the Bible" at Zion! Our goal is simply stated: "Each one in God's Word each day!" We want you, and I do mean you, to join us and be blessed! I am here to help you get started; let me know what questions you have or what resources you need and I am happy to help!

JUNIOR AND SENIOR HIGH YOUTH NEWS

REAL. PRESENT. GOD.

This is the theme for the National Youth Gathering. For those of us that are attending, those doing other things this summer and for our Zion friends who read this and support us; during the next three months we will be looking at each word in the theme REAL. PRESENT. GOD. Looking at Psalm 46. Look it up and use it as your “Each one in God’s Word each day!”



Real.

“Real” has several potential connotations but we will be focusing in on two of them. First, “real” as in physical, earthly, tangible, not a dress rehearsal, actual. And second, “real” as in authentic, not pretending, candid, honest, frank, vulnerable.

Real life is broken and messy.

Psalm 46:1-3 shows us its physical, tangible: “God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore, we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling.” These images convey problems and instability. They affirm that this created world is broken. In this very physical life, real life, things don’t always go as they should.

This brokenness makes things messy. When something works the way it ought to it goes smoothly and cleanly. But breakdowns cause complications and generally make a mess of things. Even good things get caught up in the mess when the system is broken. As a result, we live in this tangled mess in which good gifts from God (physical health, burritos, medicine, and naps) are not only damaged and imperfect, but can even be twisted into contributing to the greater mess (the idol of self-image, Taco Bell, chemical addiction and full-blown sloth).

Real life in this real broken world means that we need help to navigate the mess and try to disentangle sin from sinful uses of good gifts. “Real life is broken and messy” gives us permission to acknowledge the real hurts and pains in our lives. It allows us to name things that are wrong and not right in our life or in the world around us.

“Real life is broken” helps us to affirm that this world and this life are real. At the same time, we can be brutally honest about what’s wrong with this world and how sin has very real (emotional, physical, mental, social, etc.) consequences.

Because Jesus is real, I can be real.

Now we combine the two senses of “real.” Both “real” as in physical, earthly, tangible, actual as well as “real” as in authentic, not pretending, candid, honest, frank, vulnerable. It begins by acknowledging a truth about Jesus. Jesus is real. Jesus is not fictional. Jesus is not a fairytale character. Jesus is real both as God and as man, but the emphasis here is more on His humanity.

Jesus is a real man. In every sense of the word. During His time on earth, he ate and drank. He woke and slept. He clipped His toenails and burped. This Jesus experienced, more than we can ever imagine, the real brokenness of this world. He was tempted in every way as we are. And what’s more, He bore our sins on the cross. “For our sake [God the Father] made [Jesus] to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God”. God made Him into sin. Jesus didn’t just die for sins generally. He suffered for your sin. And he suffered for your sins, each and every one. He really dealt with them, really died for them and has really removed them from you as far as the east is from the west.

Therefore, we don’t have to pretend before Jesus. We can be real. We don’t have to act like we’ve got it all together. We don’t have to minimize our failings or our fears. We can be real with Jesus in prayer. This means that we can confess openly and honestly. In addition to being real with Jesus, we can be real in other areas of our lives. We can be honest with ourselves, with our family, with our friends. We don’t have to pretend to have it all together. You don’t have to have it all together. Because Jesus is real, you can be real.

RED LETTER CHALLENGE

We finished the Red Letter Challenge as a church four months ago! Reminders and refreshers have been in the bulletins and newsletters.

Zach Zender, the author, has 5 reasons to take on the Red Letter Challenge during Lent. This would be a great time to get out your book and go through the challenge again and see how you have grown. Also to find areas in which you still need to grow. So, consider taking on the Red Letter Challenge again!

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6, 2019!

Here are Zach's 5 quick reasons why Lent is the perfect time to implement Red Letter Challenge:

1. Lent is 40 days and the RLC is 40 days. Kinda perfect...okay, that one was obvious!
2. In the RLC you look to Jesus and His words, which is where our eyes ought to be in this season.
3. In the RLC, you take time each day for self-examination. The workbook is written in a way for people to write, journal, draw and scribble their thoughts. It also has weekly small group materials (videos and study guides) to come together to discuss those thoughts.
4. It will produce results well past the 40 days of Lent. Many churchgoers practice "giving up" something for Lent. But I've noticed, as good as that practice can be, if you don't replace it or "pick up" something new most will go right back to what they've done in the past. So if you give up soda for 40 days, that's great, but what about after the 40 days are over. Pop another Coke bottle? Is that really the life change that you, as their pastor or mentor, wanted for them? The RLC encourages people to "pick up" the habit of putting Christ's words into practice and I simply don't believe there is anything more valuable.
5. It culminates with Easter. The final chapter of RLC focuses on "Going." This is the perfect time to issue a church-wide challenge to "Go" and invite lots of people to your Easter service. You will be able to capitalize on the momentum of the RLC and likely see more people at Easter services than you ever have before!

Oh, and one more bonus. There's going to be thousands of others doing it at the same time and I really believe there's power in numbers!



ASSISTIVE LISTENING DEVICES AND MONITORS

Zion is making some enhancements to our worship setting. One of the enhancements is the addition of assistive listening devices. Zion has purchased a assistive listening system and individual members can use and return one of the four units. The units are available in the Welcome Desk. Each unit has its own volume control. The units have ear pieces, but they accept any standard minijack headphone. If you have telecoil-equipped hearing aids, there are two neck loops available.



The other enhancement comes from the incredible response, we received from the unified worship service in September, when all of the song lyrics were projected. Two large monitors will be installed in the coming weeks, once installed all of the liturgy, and lyrics will be shown on the screens. Pictures and videos can also be displayed during the service.

Catechism Corner

5 Honor your father and your mother.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not despise or anger our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them.

54. Why does this commandment focus on parents and other authorities?

- A. A mother and father uniquely serve as God's representatives through whom He bestows and nurtures human life on earth.
- B. Other authorities (legal guardians, pastors, teachers, employers, government officials) also serve as God's representatives for the support and protection of our life on earth.

55. How do we fear and love God in keeping the Fourth Commandment? We fear and love God by not despising our parents, guardians, or other authorities. Despising means

- A. looking down upon them or making fun of them;
Proverbs 23:22 Listen to your father who gave you life, and do not despise your mother when she is old.
- B. disobeying or rebelling against their God-given authority.
Proverbs 15:20 A wise son makes a glad father, but a foolish man despises his mother.

We fear and love God by receiving and recognizing parents and authorities as His representatives. We do this by

- A. honoring them;

- B. serving and coming to the aid of our parents;
John 19:25-27
- C. obeying our parents, pastors, teachers, employers, and government authorities;
Ephesians 6:1-3; Hebrews 13:17; Romans 13:1
- D. loving and cherishing our parents and other authorities on account of their God-given vocations.
Luke 2:51

FAITHFUL, PATIENT SEAMSTRESSES,

On Saturday we were given permission to distribute your beautifully made hygiene kits to a group of beautiful young women.

In my introduction I reminded the girls that their bodies are of great value and that God has given each girl the responsibility of caring for and protecting her whole body (body, mind, and spirit). I also told the girls about the groups of church ladies in America who spent months making the hygiene kits especially for them. At this point the girls all clapped!!

I was followed by a local women's leader who is one of the founders of the school. She spoke about the importance of making the most of the opportunity they now have to study, the dangers associated with premarital sex, and about HIV.

A nurse then talked about basic hygiene, common female issues, and sexually transmitted diseases. She also demonstrated how to use the kits. At the end, the girls were given a chance to ask questions. Most of these were about menstruation.

The attached photos tell you the rest. Sorry about the two that are out of focus. My favorite is the backpack photo. These girls were heading to their dorm. All I did was ask them to stand still so the photo would be in focus. We distributed kits to 165 students. Half of the students had already finished their exams and gone home so we'll do another similar distribution in January for those who weren't there on Saturday.

Needless to say, it was a rewarding, informative, and fun day for all of us. I thought of you the whole time and so wished at least one of you could have been there to see the expressions of delight in the girls' faces. Many made a point of thanking me afterwards. But we all know the thanks goes to you and your teams of seamstresses.

They then get to meet their maker, and because of the grief they have experienced; he decides to grant them one wish each, before they enter Paradise.



In Hebrews 10:23 we read - "Let us hold unwaveringly to the hope we profess for He who promised, is faithful".


Our hope is in the One who is a perfect promise of love. We thank God for His promise to hear our prayers and to keep us close to Him -- Marlene Grunow
